****e-Learning for Healthcare – January Update****

e-Learning for Healthcare Foundation e-Learning Programme: Professional Capability: 1 Acts professionally and Professional Capability: 2 Delivers patient centred care and maintains trust

Developed by the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges in partnership with Health Education England e-Learning for Healthcare (HEE e-LfH) and approved by UKFPO – Foundation is a free e-learning programme for Foundation doctors.

Do you need to complete parts of the curriculum on your e-portfolio which you do not cover in day-to-day practice? If so, try some of our free e-learning mapped directly to the Foundation Professional Capabilities (Training Outcomes) in the 2016 Foundation Curriculum.

The e-learning sessions in these Professional Capabilities explore the relationship between doctors and their patients and how to deliver effective patient centered care.

'Handling Complaints' provides essential information about common factors leading to complaints, how to minimise these, the procedures involved and what your responsibilities are as a foundation doctor.

The Mental Capacity Act (MCA) protects the right of vulnerable people and this group of sessions cover topics such as assessing capacity, consent, patient autonomy and safeguarding. You will also consider the multidisciplinary team (MDT) approach to healthcare in the hospital and patient support after discharge.

****Horus Update****

Managing rotations and placements – Important check before ARCP

Colleagues across England use this terminology to mean a variety of things - Horus uses the FP Reference Guide (2017) definitions of “[rotation](#)” and “[placement](#)”.

- All content in Horus that contributes to the completion of F1 should be under one F1 rotation (and same for F2).
- Some administrators have not set this up correctly in Horus for out of synch foundation doctors (for example LTFT FDs and those who have taken time out of training) and **this causes issues at ARCP**.
- All administrators and any ‘non-standard’ FDs should check that their rotations have been set up correctly.
 - that is, those not undertaking the ‘standard’ three 4 month placements in an F1 rotation and three 4 month placements in an F2 rotation

****ATDG/ASiT Pan-Specialty Audit on Training Conditions for Junior Doctors****

The ATDG (Academy Trainee Doctors' Group) and ASiT are carrying out a pan-specialty junior doctor snapshot audit, with the aim to provide frontline evidence of training conditions for doctors in the UK. Evidence that we hope will be used to influence policy change and advocate for doctors across foundation and specialties.

The survey is anonymous and focuses specifically on winter pressures. Foundation input to this audit is essential, and therefore all foundation trainees are encouraged to complete the survey. ATDG plan to use the data for negotiation with HEE and devolved nations health boards to improve the training environment and working conditions and ultimately improve patient care as a result.
