****e-Learning for Healthcare – February Update****

e-Learning for Healthcare sessions in Foundation e-Learning Project: Professional Capability: 3 Behaves in accordance with ethical and legal requirements

Developed by the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges in partnership with Health Education England e-Learning for Healthcare (HEE e-LfH) and approved by UKFPO – Foundation is a free e-learning programme for Foundation doctors.

Do you need to complete parts of the curriculum on your e-portfolio which you do not cover in day-to-day practice? If so try some of our free e-learning mapped directly to the Foundation Professional Capabilities (Training Outcomes) in the 2016 Foundation Curriculum.

The Mental Health Act protects the rights of vulnerable adults and children; a group of the e-learning sessions outline the responsibilities of the people who care for them.

You will find out how the GMC supports your career development, looking at the topics of registration, the Foundation Programme and your career development.

There are sessions which focus on the safeguarding of adults and children in primary and secondary care.

****Horus Update****

E-portfolio – end of placement reports – Placement 1 - LAST CHANCE!

Forms can be created, edited (where appropriate) and signed *up to 3 months* after the end of the placement they're attached to. This means that, for example, [CS](#) and [ES](#) end of placement reports for placement 1 (usually 1 August - 4 December 2018) can only be created and signed until **4 March 2019**. Foundation doctors and their clinical/educational supervisors should ensure any remaining reports for placement 1 are completed before the end of next week.

Horus ePortfolio – Import of new F1s/standalone F2s from Oriel

In Oriel, the “Employing Trust” drop-down options match exactly with the Horus list of trusts. However, the Oriel “Site” fields are all free-text, which means these entries will not necessarily match. For example, some placements are listed as “Hospital X/Hospital Y” (to indicate split-site or tbc) or “City” (instead of “City Hospital”).

- Foundation schools have a list of all the trusts and sites in Horus.
- Foundation school managers have agreed that this year, all placements at “Sites” entered into Oriel that do not exactly match a Horus site will be imported at trust level.
- Any required updates or changes will need to be made by trust or foundation school administrators manually in Horus after the data has been imported (June 2019).

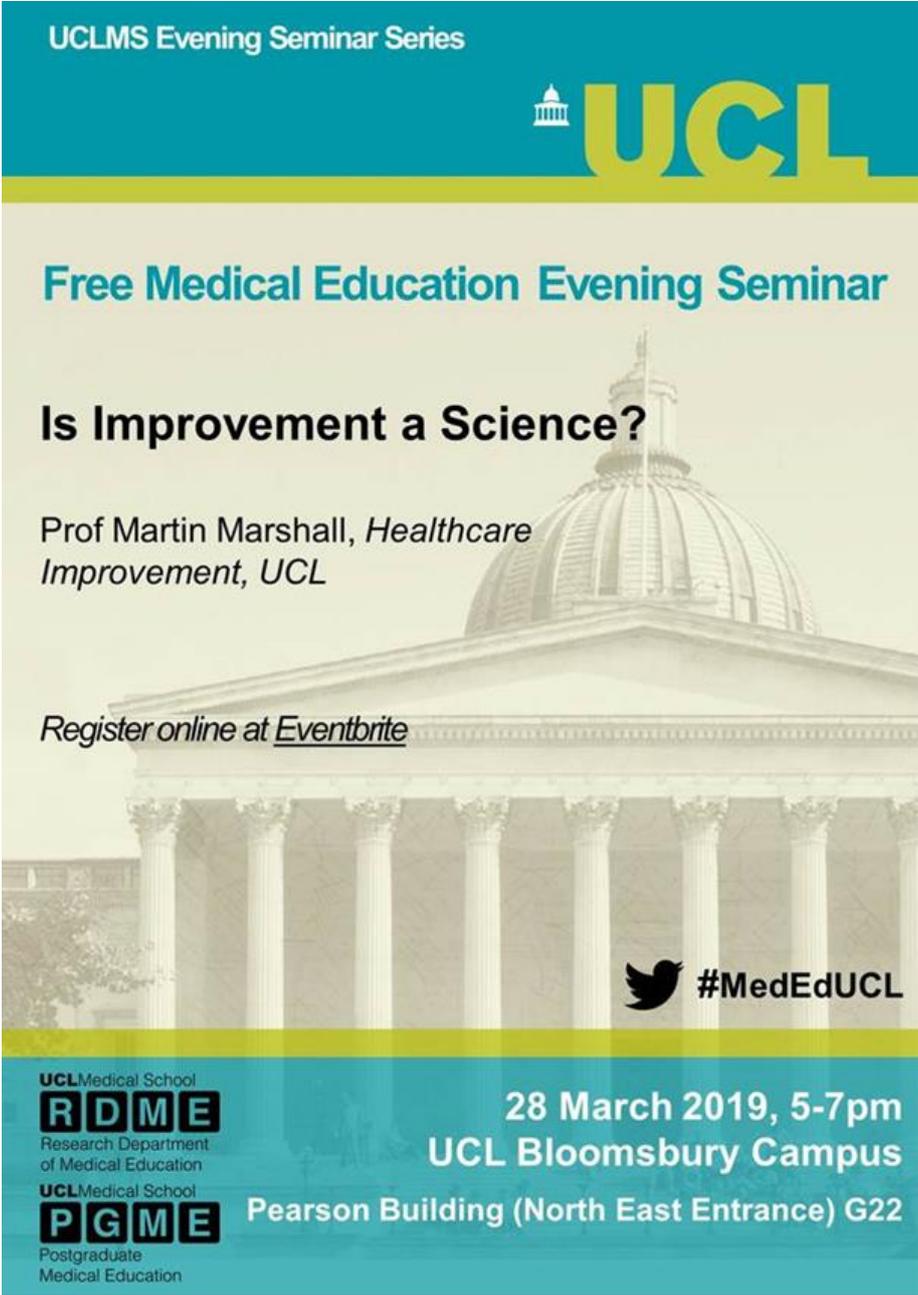
